Mark: Chapter 4

- I. The Parable of the Soils (v.1-20)
 - A. The Parable (v.1-9)
 - 1. Key parable to understand (v.13), but we have been given the secret (v.11)
 - 2. παραβολή placing one thing by the side of another
 - 3. Contextual background of the sower and seeds
 - a) Path goes along or through the field
 - b) Rocky ground not referring to large rocks in ground, but thin layer of soil covering limestone a few inches below surface
 - c) Visible thorn bushes would likely be burned, but roots remain
 - d) Good soil action separated into three parts as well as yield
 - 4. He who has ears to hear
 - B. The Secret of the Kingdom of God (v.10-12)
 - 1. The heirs of the secret
 - 2. The content of the secret (Romans 16:25-26)
 - 3. Judgment on those outside (Isaiah 6:9-10)
 - C. The Explanation of the Parable (v.13-20)
 - 1. Two precursory questions
 - 2. The seed is the Word of God / Word of the kingdom (Luke 8:11; Matthew 13:19)
 - 3. Attitude of the hearers towards the Word determines the final result
 - 4. Parallel explanation of the locations
 - a) Satan coming away to take away the Word that has been heard (1 Peter 5:8; Ephesians 2:2-3)
 - b) Immediate joy but then trials (Luke 14:27-33; Matthew 10:22; John 15:18-21; Matthew 7:24-29)
 - c) Threefold distractions (1 John 2:15-16; 1 Timothy 6:10; James 4:1-3)
 - d) Good soil again split into three parts (John 15:5, 9-10; Galatians 5:22-23; Luke 3:9-14).
- II. More Parables (v.21-34) "And he said"
 - A. The Responsibility of the Citizens (v.21-23)
 - 1. Private lesson
 - 2. Light of the world (Ephesians 5:8-10; Matthew 5:16)
 - 3. Eventual manifestation of the "secrets" after the resurrection; parables now, preaching later!
 - 4. Precursor to the Great Commission
 - B. The Valuation of the Citizens (v.24-25)
 - 1. "What you hear" spiritual understanding and not material blessing

- 2. Insert the what you hears into the next sentence
- 3. Not merely reciprocal, but even more will be added
- 4. Insert the understanding of what you hear into the next sentence
- 5. For those who don't understand, even what exposure they have will not benefit them
- 6. Challenge to value what they hear rightly
- C. The Growth of the Citizens (v.26-29)
 - 1. Probably talking again to crowd (no "to them")
 - 2. Growth independent of sower (1 Corinthians 3:6-7)
 - 3. Progressive growth
 - 4. Two probable interpretations:
 - a) Sower puts in action / responsibly manages the fruit at the appropriate time
 - b) End times (e.g. Matthew 13:24-30; Revelation 14:14-16)
- D. The Kingdom of God (v.30-32)
 - 1. Parable for the kingdom of God, not to be confused with faith (e.g. Matthew 17:20)
 - 2. Mustard seed probably referring to common black mustard, *Sinapis nigra*, smallest seed the Jews were accustomed to sowing in fields
 - a) Grows to be a thick-stemmed plant around 10-12 feet in height
 - 3. Not many understood and believed, but Christ is assuring the disciples of the growth of the kingdom
 - 4. Bird of the air probably referring to Ezekiel 17:23-24; from all tribes and people and languages in Revelation
- E. The Parabolic Teaching (v.33-34)
 - 1. Parables to match the heart of the crowd; direct teaching to parables to match the dullness of heart of the listeners
 - 2. But to thee ones eager to understand the secret of the kingdom (Mark 4:10), Jesus explained all
- III. Jesus Calms the Storm (v.35-41)
 - A. Ceaseless Ministry of the Christ (v.35-36)
 - 1. Teaching for the whole day, and left "just as he was"
 - B. Consternated Concern of the Disciples (v.37-38)
 - 1. Strong winds characteristic of the Sea of Galilee 682 feet below sea level and surrounded by highlands; we must not underestimate the true concern in the situation
 - 2. Full depth of Jesus's humanity wearied just as we are
 - 3. Do you not care? Relational question, not a question of power / authority. Teacher here, "Lord" and "Master" in Matthew and Luke, respectively.
 - C. Creation's Response to the Creator (v.39-41)

- 1. Jesus's power over all creation (John 1:1-3)
- 2. Fear and faith (Matthew 6:25-32; Romans 8:28)
- 3. "General revelation" serves to instill fear (Judges 13:22; Job 42:1-6; Isaiah 6:5; Revelation 1:17)
- 4. Disciples starting to understand (c.f. Isaiah 53:2-3)
